About the ECPR standing group on Regulatory Governance

The study of regulation and regulatory governance is attracting an increasing attention in the field of political science. The group's founding members and those who joined it subsequently believe that the study of regulation & governance is increasingly important topic in the social sciences. The aim of our group is to provide a platform and infrastructure for encouraging studies in this area and the creation of an institutional arena for mutual interaction and debate.

We aim to bring together a broad range of scholars working on (various aspects) of 'regulatory governance' in all parts of the world, including scholars from fields such as law, economics, sociology, criminology, (social) psychology and history for a fruitful exchange of ideas and knowledge on regulatory governance. However, as a Standing Group of the European Consortium for Political Research (ECPR), the main focus of the group will be on the political aspects of regulation. We believe in openness and pluralism and intend to open the group not only for different disciplines but to different theoretical perspective and to variety of methodological approaches.

About Institut Barcelona d'Estudis Internacionals (IBEI)

The Institut Barcelona d'Estudis Internacionals (IBEI) was set up in February 2004 with the goal of becoming a leading European institution for advanced research and postgraduate training of future generations of professionals and experts dealing with international affairs of public concern. The Institute was formally established as a private foundation by the five public universities in the Greater Barcelona area, along with the CIDOB Foundation and five government institutions: the Generalitat, Catalonia's regional government; Barcelona City Hall; the Diputació, Barcelona province's government; the Mancomunitat, the association of Greater Barcelona municipalities; and Spain's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation. In the summer of 2004, IBEI was granted formal recognition as an inter-university research institute by the Generalitat's Department of Universities, Research and Information Society.

The Institute has become, first and foremost, a centre for advanced research in international studies. IBEI's core academic staff is made up of tenure-track professors and postdoctoral researchers, and also engages visiting professors and affiliated faculty members of the Barcelona universities that created the Institute. It organizes research activity within three interdisciplinary programmes, which respectively study the implications of globalization for the economy, for governance and for security.

Giandomenico Majone Prize

The ECPR Standing Group on Regulatory Governance awards the Giandomenico Majone Prize for papers to be presented at its 5th Bienial Conference on Regulatory Governance between Global and Local. The prize is in honor of Giandomenico Majone for his outstanding contribution for the study of regulatory governance in the European Union and well beyond it. This award recognizes outstanding research by scholars in early stages of her or his career in the field of regulatory governance from all relevant disciplinary backgrounds. The Prize is limited to scholars having completed their PhD no more than seven years before the deadline for submission.

The Prize Committee invited nominations from the panel chairs and the organizing committee of the conference. Papers were also be submitted for consideration directly by authors as long as they were taking part in the conference and were presented at the conference. Papers were be selected among those presented in the Standing Group Conference. Published or already accepted papers in peer-reviewed journals were not eligible for the competition, and so are papers co-authored with senior scholars. The Prize awards 300 Euros.

Standing Group Award for Regulatory Studies Development

Since the Giandomenico Majone Prize is aimed at early-career scholars, the Steering Committee of the ECPR Standing Group on Regulatory Governance has decided to establish a new award in order to be able to recognize the contributions to the field of regulatory governance by senior scholars: the Standing GroupAward for Regulatory Studies Development. The newly established award bestows recognition on a senior scholar who promoted a new teaching initiative, opened a new research sub field, delivered crucial publications or made a significant public contribution to the field (i.e., a large dataset, a new technique).

After a nomination round and deliberation among the Steering Committee, which acted as a jury for this award, the Committee was very pleased to grant David Levi-Faur for the first Standing Group Award for Regulatory Studies Development.

David Levi-Faur is the first recipient of this award because of his successful efforts to create an academic regulatory governance community, as exemplified by his initiative to co-found the ECPR Standing Group on Regulation and Governance in 2005 and because of his high impact research.



David Levi-Faur is a professor at the Federmann School of Public Policy and the Department of Political Science at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. Together with John Braithwaite and Cary Coglianese he was the founding editor of the successful Wiley-Blackwell journal Regulation & Governance. He has held research and teaching positions at the University of Haifa, the University of Oxford, the Australian National University, the University of Manchester and the Freie Universität Berlin as well as visiting positions at the London School of Economics, the University of Amsterdam, the University of Utrecht and the University of California (Berkeley). His numerous and much-cited publications include special issues of the Annals of the American Academy of Political and Social Sciences (The Global Diffusion of Regulatory Capitalism, co-edited with Jacint Jordana) and Governance (Varieties of RegulatoryCapitalism) and editorships of the Oxford Handbook of Governance (OUP, 2012) and The Handbook of the Politics of Regulation (Edward Elgar, 2011). Together with Avishai Benish he is editing the working paper series Jerusalem Papers in Regulation & Governance.

Both awards will be granted during official dinner of the Biennial Conference, the 26 June 2014 (20:30), where the recipient of the award for the Regulatory Studies Development will address the conference audience with a speech.



Bjoern Conrad

Mercator Institute for China Studies (MERICS)

Before joining MERICS, Björn Conrad served as Climate Change and Environment Officer at the Rome-based Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), managing numerous environmental projects in China and its neighbouring countries. Prior to taking up this post, he worked for the Global Environment Facility at the World Bank in Washington, DC. In 2008 he initiated the Global Public Policy Institute's China Programme, with a focus on climate policy. In 2014, Conrad was appointed member of the expert committee for formulating a China Strategy for the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF). After completing his studies in Sinology, Political Science and Economics in Germany and China, Conrad moved to the US where he gained a Master in Public Policy from the Harvard Kennedy School, specialising in environmental policy and economics.



Morten Egeberg
ARENA, University of Oslo

Morten Egeberg is a Professor at the Department of Political Science and at ARENA - Centre for European Studies, University of Oslo. He was Director of ARENA 2003-2007. His field is the organization of the executive branch of government, and how its organization might impact on actual politico-administrative behaviour. Empirically, he covers EU-level bodies as well as national administrations. His articles have appeared in journals such as Public Administration, Governance, Journal of European Public Policy, Journal of Theoretical Politics, International Review of Administrative Sciences, Scandinavian Political Studies, West European Politics, European Journal of Political Research, Journal of Common Market Studies, Comparative European Politics and Public Organization Review. Recent books are Multilevel Union Administration. The Transformation of Executive Politics in Europe (2006) and Towards a New Executive Order in Europe? (with D. Curtin - 2009).



Andreas Goldthau Central European University and Harvard Kennedy School of Government

Dr Andreas Goldthau is Marie Curie Senior Fellow and Visiting Scholar with the Geopolitics of Energy Project at Harvard University's Belfer Center for Science and International Affairs. He is also Associate Professor and former Head of the Public Policy Department at Central European University, an American graduate school based in Budapest, and a Fellow with the Global Public Policy Institute in Berlin. His academic career includes stints with the RAND Corporation, and SAIS, Johns Hopkins University, where he also served as an Adjunct Professor of its MSc program in Energy Policy and Climate. Andreas' research interests focus on energy security and global governance issues related to oil and gas. He has authored, co-authored or co-edited the Wiley Handbook on Global Energy Policy (Wiley Blackwell, 2013), Dynamics of Energy Governance in Europe and Russia (Palgrave, 2012), Global Energy Governance. The New Rules of the Game (Brookings Press, 2010), Imported Oil and U.S. National Security (RAND, 2009) and OPEC (Hanser, 2009). At Belfer, he conducts research on energy technology innovation and transfer, with a focus on shale gas prospects beyond the US.



Christoph Knill Ludwig-Maximilians University München

Christoph Knill is Professor of Political Science at the University of Munich. He studied públic administration and political science at the University of Konstanz and obtained his PhD form the University of Bielefeld in 1994. He was research associate at the Max-Planck Institute for the Study of Societies in Cologne, the European University Institute in Florence, and the Max-Planck Pro- ject Group for the Study of Common Goods in Bonn). In 2010, Professor Knill has been awarded the internationally highly renowned European Research Council Advanced Grant. Prof. Knill has published numerous articles in international journals. His most important book publications include *The Europeanization of National Administrations: Patterns of Institutional Change and Persistence* (Cambridge: Cambridge University Press 2001), *Environmental Policy Convergence in Europe* (Cambridge University Press 2008, with Katharina Holzinger and Bas Arts) and *On the Road to Permissiveness: Patterns of Morality Policy Change and Convergence* (Manchester: Oxford University Press 2015, with Christian Adam and Steffen Hurka).



Miranda Schreurs
Environmental Policy Research Centre (FFU), Freie Universität Berlin

Miranda A. Schreurs (PhD, University of Michigan) researches in the field of comparative environmental politics and policy in Europe, the United States, and East Asia. In 2007, she was recruited to the Freie Universität Berlin as professor of comparative politics and director of the university's Environmental Policy Research Centre. In 2008, Schreurs became a member of the German Advisory Council on the Environment. She is chair of the European Environment and Sustainable Development Advisory Councils, a network of advisory councils across Europe and member of the Berlin Climate Change Advisory Commission and the Enquete Commission for a New Energy System for Berlin.



Manuel Szapiro
College of Europe

Manuel Szapiro is Visiting professor in the European Political and Administrative Studies Department, College of Europe. He joined the European Commission in 2003 as a member of the Task Force "Future of the European Union and institutional questions". Manuel Szapiro was previously Senior Lecturer at the European Institute of Public Administration in Maastricht and Director of Studies and Lecturer in Sciences Po Paris (since 2000). Manuel Szapiro is author of various books and articles on topics related to EU institutions and integration processes addressing both academic and policy makers.



Jarle Trondal ARENA, University of Oslo

Jarle Trondal is Professor in Political Science and Public Administration at University of Agder, Department of Political Science. He is also Professor in European Studies at University of Oslo, ARENA Centre for European Studies, and Honorary Professor at University of Copenhagen. His main research interests are in European studies, public administration, organizational studies, and the study of order (trans)formation.



Koen Verhoest University of Antwerp

Koen Verhoest is since February 2012 Research Professor in Comparative Public Administration and Globalization at the Department of Political Science (Research Group on Public Administration and Management), University of Antwerp, and is partially affiliated to the KULeuven. His main research interest is on the organizational aspects of public tasks and their (regulatory) governance in multi-level and multi-actor contexts, including the autonomy, control and coordination of (regulatory and other) agencies, as well as the governance of liberalized markets and the governance of public private partnerships. He has published in journals like Governance, International Review of Administrative Sciences, Public Management Review and Organizational Studies. Since July 2012 he is co-chairing together with assoc. Prof. Anne Meuwese (University of Tilburg) the steering committee of the ECPR Standing Group on Regulatory Governance.



Fariborz Zelli Lund University

Dr. Fariborz Zelli is an Associate Professor at the Department of Political Science at Lund University. His major research interests include institutional complexity, global climate governance, deforestation, and the environmental role of the World Trade Organization. Prior to joining Lund University, he worked at the German Development Institute and the Tyndall Centre for Climate Change Research. He is an elected board member of the Environmental Studies Section of the International Studies Association. His publications include a special issue of *Global Environmental Politics* on *The Institutional Fragmentation of Global Environmental Governance* (2013, as guest editor) and *Global Climate Governance Beyond 2012* (2010, Cambridge University Press).




Joaquin Almunia
Vice-President of the European Commission and
Commissioner responsible for competition

Joaquín Almunia Amann is a Spanish politician and prominent member of the European Commission, currently responsible for competition under the second mandate of President Barroso. He was previously responsible for economic and monetary affairs in Barroso's previous mandate. Almunia graduated with degrees in economics and law in 1971 and 1972, respectively, from the University of Deusto in Bilbao, and completed follow-up studies at the École Pratique des Hautes Études in Paris, France, from 1970 to 1971. He also completed a program at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University for senior managers in government in 1991. He was an associate lecturer on employment and social security law at the University of Alcalá de Henares in Madrid, Spain, from 1991 to 1994. Almunia was a PSOE Member of the Cortes Generales from 1979 to 2004, representing Madrid. He was the minister of employment and social security from 1982 to 1986. He served as the minister of public administration from 1986 to 1991 He was also the PSOE spokesperson from 1994 to 1997. Almunia was the director of the research program on "equality and redistribution of income" at the Fundación Argentaria from 1991 to 1994. In 2002 he founded and served as director of a progressive think tank called Laboratorio de Alternativas. He first joined the Prodi Commission on 26 April 2004.

The New Regulatory Space. Reframing Democratic Governance (Edward Elgar) Frank Vibert, London School of Economics (LSE)

This groundbreaking book analyses changing patterns of governance in modern democratic societies. Frank Vibert discusses how far we should be concerned about such changes and what we should be concerned about. Crucially, Vibert clarifies the status of regulation, revealing how regulation should be viewed, not only as a technique offering specific responses to particular policy problems, but also in its new role as the key mechanism for making adjustments between the different systems of coordination used in contemporary governance.





Democracy in crisis? Politics, Governance and Policy (Macmillan)

Yannis Papadopoulos, University of Lausanne

Democracy in Crisis provides a systematic assessment of the key trends in democratic politics, such as the crisis of parties, the roles of the media and of the courts, the internationalization of policymaking, changes in governance and administrative reforms. It examines the central challenges today's democracies face, and the implications of each challenge for the health of democratic systems. It addresses key questions such as:

- Do citizens have meaningful opportunities to exercise power?
- How much control do politicians have over decision-making?
- Are technocrats and cause groups gaining in influence?
- Are politics and policy-making disconnected?
- Have we entered the "winter" of democracy?



Friday 27 June 2014 (11:15-12:30)

The Economic Constitution (Oxford University Press)

Tony Prosser, University of Bristol

This book sets out different meanings of an economic constitution, and applies them to key areas of economic management, including taxation and public borrowing, the management of public spending, (including the Spending Review), monetary policy, financial services regulation, industrial policy (including state shareholdings) and government contracting. It analyses the key institutions involved such as the Treasury and the Bank of England, also including a number of less well-known bodies such as the Office for Budget Responsibility. There is also coverage of the international context in which these institutions operate especially the European Union and the World Trade Organisation. It thus provides an account of the public law applying to economic management in the UK.

This book also adopts a critical approach, assessing the degree to which there is coherence in the arrangements for economic management, the degree to which economic policy-making is constrained by constitutional norms, and the degree to which economic management is subject to deliberation and accountability through Parliament, the courts and other institutions.
